

GENEALOGICAL REPORT

Confirmation of the Suárez-Navas Lineages

Prepared for family archive and family distribution

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This report consolidates the current genealogical reconstruction of the Suárez and Navas family branches and the convergence of those branches through General Pedro Escipi3n Suárez Duarte and Juana Antonia Navas Peña. It is prepared as a family-archive genealogical report. It is not a court-certified legal genealogy, but several key links are supported by parish-record evidence and by the reviewed family-tree continuity.

Archival status: working confirmation report for family use, subject to future updates if additional primary records are located.

I. Purpose and executive conclusion

This report summarizes the genealogical connection between the Suárez and Navas family lines as currently reconstructed from reviewed parish evidence and family-tree continuity. Its purpose is archival and familial: to preserve a clear record of the lineage that joins the Suárez Gualdrón / Suárez Galvis / Suárez Angarita / Suárez Duarte line with the Navas Mantilla / Navas Reyes / Navas Suárez / Navas Peña line.

The central conclusion is that the Suárez-Navas family line is formed by the convergence of two branches in the Santander and northeastern Andean family network: the Suárez paternal line descending to General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte, and the Navas line descending to Juana Antonia Navas Peña. These lines converge through the marriage of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte and Juana Antonia Navas Peña, from which the later Suárez Navas family continuity proceeds.

II. Naming convention used in this report

In the Spanish and Colombian naming system used here, the first surname generally reflects the paternal line and the second surname generally reflects the maternal line. Thus, Suárez Gualdrón means a Suárez paternal surname and a Gualdrón maternal surname; Navas Reyes means a Navas paternal surname and a Reyes maternal surname. This rule is essential for interpreting the progression of the family line.

- Suárez Gualdrón: Suárez paternal line; Gualdrón maternal line.
- Suárez Galvis: Suárez paternal line; Galvis maternal line.
- Suárez Angarita: Suárez paternal line; Angarita maternal line.
- Suárez Duarte: Suárez paternal line; Duarte maternal line.
- Navas Reyes: Navas paternal line; Reyes maternal line.
- Navas Suárez: Navas paternal line; Suárez maternal line.
- Navas Peña: Navas paternal line; Peña maternal line.
- Suárez Navas: Suárez paternal line; Navas maternal line.

III. Confirmed Suárez branch

The Suárez branch relevant to this report proceeds from Joaquín Suárez and Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón through Juan Antonio Suárez Gualdrón, José María Suárez Galvis, Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita, and General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte.

1. Joaquín Suárez + Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón

Ancestral Suárez-Gualdrón couple. Late eighteenth-century baptism records identify them as paternal grandparents in the Suárez Galvis line. The Bonifacia record appears to read Joaquín Suárez Gómez, a high-probability paleographic reading requiring continued caution.

2. Juan Antonio Suárez Gualdrón + Juliana Galvis

Documented parents in late eighteenth-century parish records, including records for Bonifacia Suárez Galvis and Juana Manuela Suárez Galvis. Juan Antonio is the key bridge from Suárez-Gualdrón to Suárez-Galvis.

3. José María Suárez Galvis + Buenaventura Angarita

Continues the Suárez paternal line into the nineteenth century and into the Suárez Angarita generation.

4. Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita + Eudosia Duarte Uscátegui

Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita, born 30 June 1831, is confirmed as father of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte.

5. General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte

Principal Suárez Duarte figure in the late nineteenth-century family and historical line. He marries Juana Antonia Navas Peña, joining the Suárez and Navas branches.

Suárez branch lineage: Joaquín Suárez + Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón -> Juan Antonio Suárez Gualdrón + Juliana Galvis -> José María Suárez Galvis + Buenaventura Angarita -> Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita + Eudisia Duarte Uscátegui -> General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte.

IV. Confirmed Navas branch

The Navas branch relevant to this report proceeds from Don José Domingo Navas y Miranda and Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos through Pedro Ignacio Navas, Eusebio Navas Reyes, Gabriel Navas Suárez, and Juana Antonia Navas Peña.

A crucial correction has been made: Ignacio Joseph Navas Mantilla and Pedro Ignacio Navas are two different sons of Don José Domingo Navas and Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos. Ignacio Joseph corresponds to the 1696 parish record. Pedro Ignacio corresponds to a separate 1712 birth/baptism line and is later confirmed as the father of Eusebio Navas Reyes in the 1746 San Juan Bautista, Girón baptism record.

1. Don José Domingo Navas y Miranda + Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos

Foundational Navas-Mantilla ancestral couple for this branch. Don José Domingo is treated as the Navas patriarch in this reconstruction.

2A. Ignacio Joseph Navas Mantilla

Born/baptized in 1696. He is a separate older son and must not be merged with Pedro Ignacio Navas.

2B. Pedro Ignacio Navas Mantilla / Don Pedro Ignacio Navas

Born/baptized in 1712. Later confirmed in parish context as Don Pedro Ignacio Navas, father of Eusebio Navas Reyes.

3. Eusebio Navas Reyes

Born/baptized in 1746 at San Juan Bautista, Girón. The record confirms his father as Don Pedro Ignacio Navas and places the Navas Reyes line on solid evidentiary ground.

4. Gabriel Navas Suárez

Born in 1783. Carries the Navas-Suárez surname structure within the line leading to Juana Antonia Navas Peña.

5. Juana Antonia Navas Peña

Descendant of the Navas line and spouse of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte. Her marriage joins the Navas and Suárez branches.

Navas branch lineage: Don José Domingo Navas y Miranda + Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos -> Pedro Ignacio Navas -> Eusebio Navas Reyes -> Gabriel Navas Suárez -> Juana Antonia Navas Peña.

V. Union of the Suárez and Navas branches

The two branches converge through the marriage of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte and Juana Antonia Navas Peña. This union forms the principal Suárez-Navas line.

- Suárez branch: Joaquín Suárez + Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón -> Juan Antonio Suárez Gualdrón -> José María Suárez Galvis -> Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita -> General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte.
- Navas branch: Don José Domingo Navas y Miranda + Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos -> Pedro Ignacio Navas -> Eusebio Navas Reyes -> Gabriel Navas Suárez -> Juana Antonia Navas Peña.
- Union: General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte + Juana Antonia Navas Peña -> Suárez Navas family continuity.

VI. Extended family continuity

For family-archive purposes, the surname progression may be summarized as: Suárez Gualdrón -> Suárez Galvis -> Suárez Angarita -> Suárez Duarte -> Suárez Navas -> Suárez Perdomo -> Suárez Vargas. This progression reflects the continuity of the paternal Suárez line through successive maternal surnames and into the modern family line.

The Suárez-Navas generation is therefore not an isolated surname event. It is the documented convergence of two branches whose descendants continue through later generations, including the Suárez Perdomo and Suárez Vargas lines.

VII. Evidentiary status

- The Suárez-Gualdrón link is supported by late eighteenth-century baptism records connecting Juan Antonio Suárez and Juliana Galvis to their children and identifying the paternal grandparents as Joaquín Suárez and Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón.
- The 1792 Bonifacia Suárez Galvis baptism record appears to identify the paternal grandfather as Don Joaquín Suárez Gómez and the paternal grandmother as Doña Antonia Guadrón / Gualdrón. This is a strong paleographic reading but should remain open to corroboration.
- Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita is confirmed as the father of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte.
- Ignacio Joseph Navas Mantilla and Pedro Ignacio Navas must be treated as two different sons of Don José Domingo Navas and Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos.
- Pedro Ignacio Navas is confirmed as father of Eusebio Navas Reyes in the 1746 San Juan Bautista, Girón baptism record.
- The marriage of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte and Juana Antonia Navas Peña forms the principal Suárez-Navas union.

VIII. Cautionary notes

The Suárez Lorión branch appears in the ancestry of Gabriel Navas Suárez through José Suárez Lorión, identified as the maternal grandfather of Gabriel Navas Suárez. At present, no confirmed connection has been established between the Suárez Lorión branch and the Suárez-Schwarz / Suárez Gualdrón line. It should remain a separate Suárez presence in the Málaga-Girón region unless future evidence proves otherwise.

Variant spellings such as Gualdrón / Guadrón are normal in colonial parish records. For family presentation, Gualdrón may remain the standardized surname while Guadrón is preserved as a documented variant reading.

IX. Final archival formulation

The Suárez-Navas family line is formed by the marriage of General Pedro Escipión Suárez Duarte and Juana Antonia Navas Peña. General Pedro Escipión descends from the Suárez line of Joaquín Suárez and Antonia Gualdrón / Guadrón, through Juan Antonio Suárez Gualdrón, José María Suárez Galvis, and Pedro Pablo Suárez Angarita. Juana Antonia Navas Peña descends from the Navas line of Don José Domingo Navas y Miranda and Doña Teresa Tomasa Mantilla de los Ríos, through Pedro Ignacio Navas, Eusebio Navas Reyes, and Gabriel Navas Suárez. Parish records support key links in both branches, including the identification of Pedro Ignacio Navas as father of Eusebio Navas Reyes in 1746 and the Suárez-Gualdrón connection through late eighteenth-century baptism records. The resulting Suárez-Navas lineage is therefore a documented family line with strong archival support.
